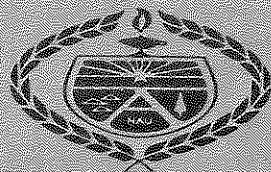

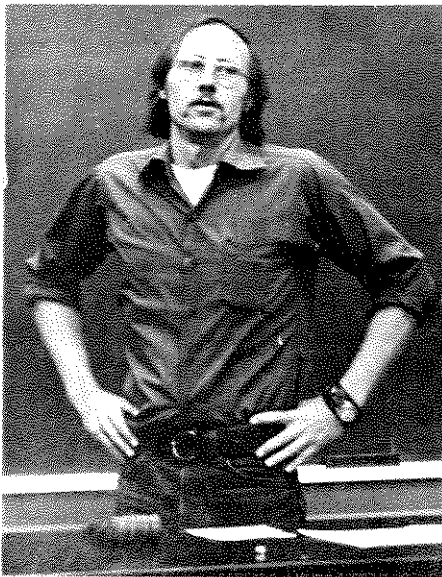

This has been a very busy year, but we find the new, integrated curriculum going much more smoothly. It seems to be achieving our objective of a broader based education leading to greater performance flexibility.

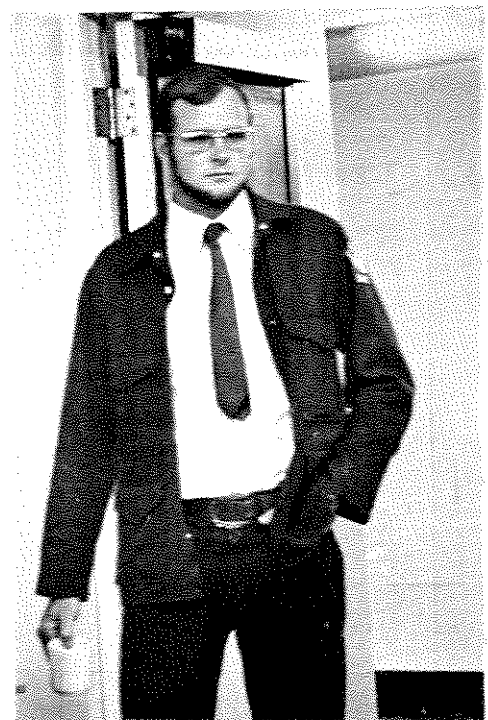

# FACULTY 'N' STAFF



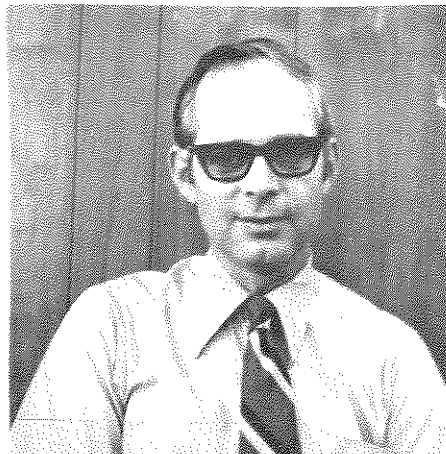

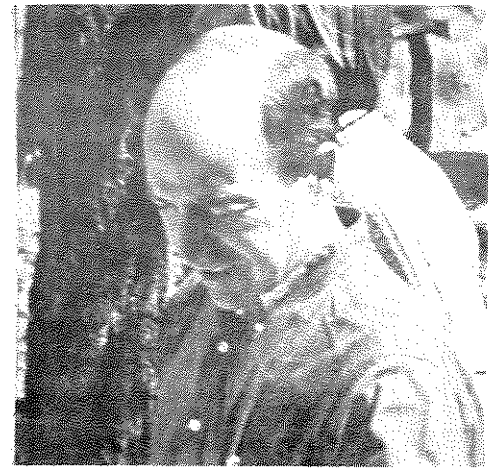

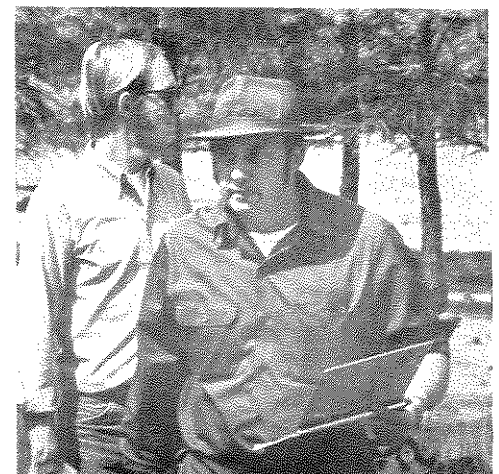


Charles O. Minor - Dean of School of Forestry. He received his D.F. from Duke forest management. His re-

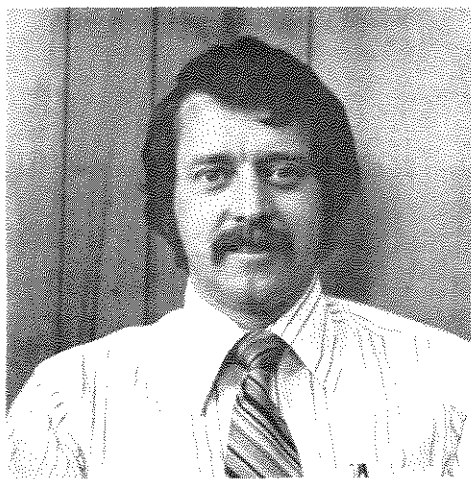
in 1958. Dr. Minor teaches search is in soil-site for Ponderosa pine and in thinning young-growth pine.
