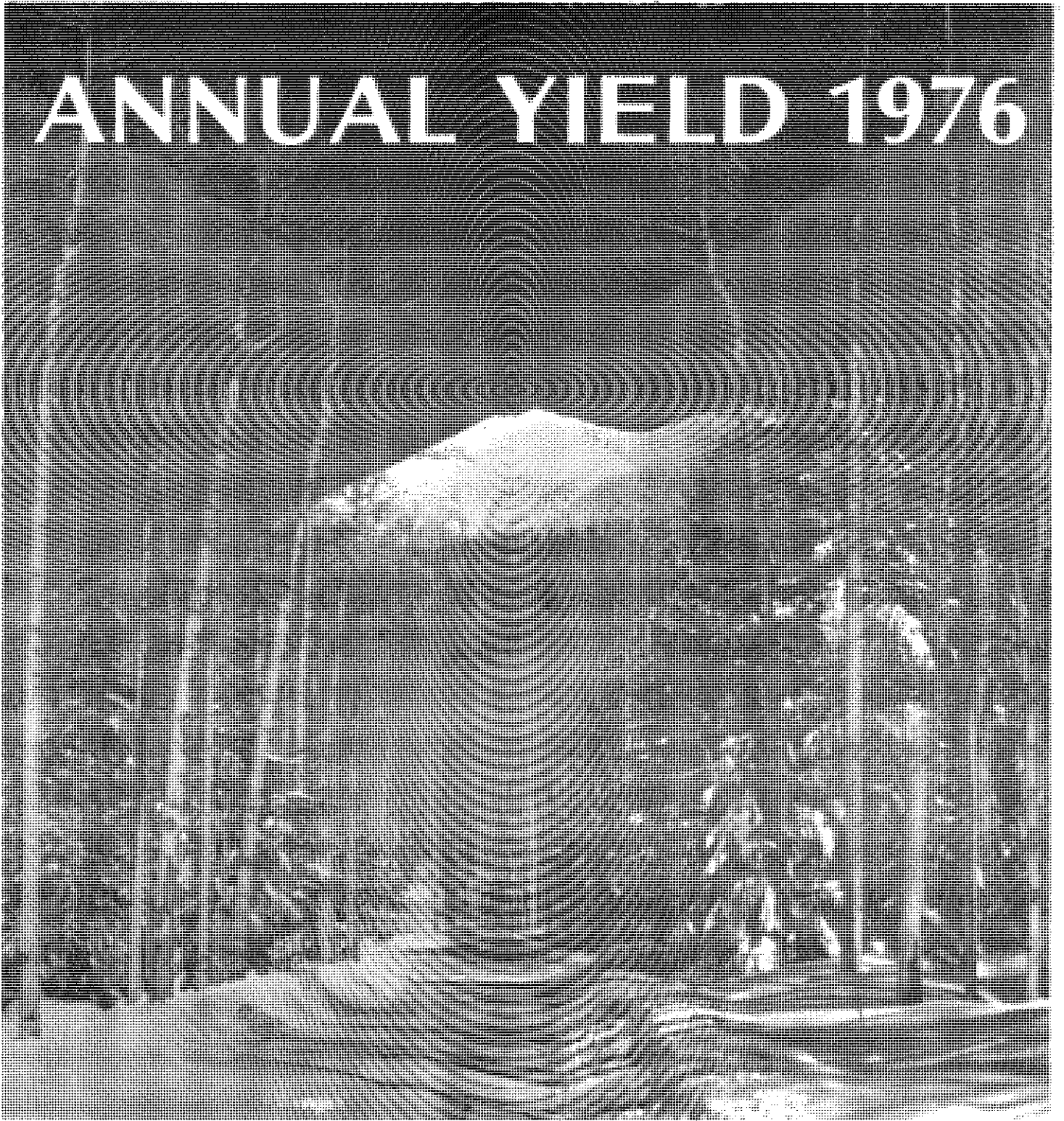

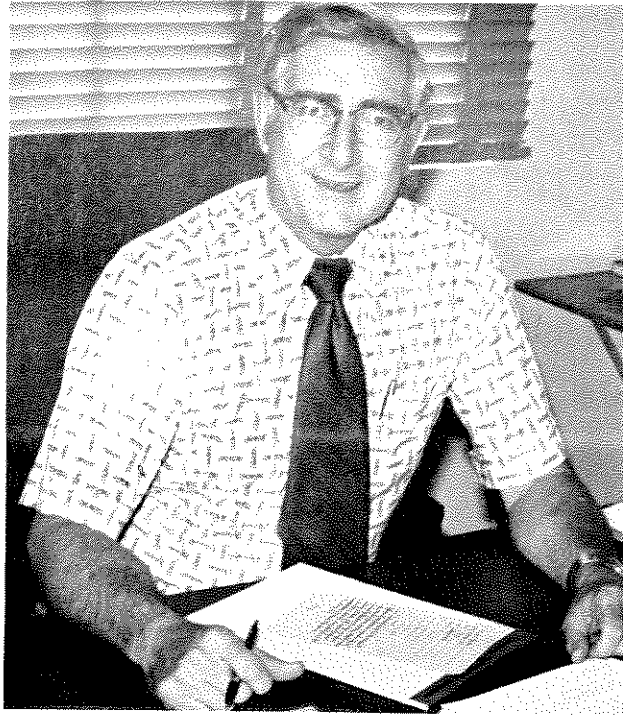


DEDICATION

MESSAGE


