[AGEC](#) Requirements: What is an AGECE? The Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) is a 35 credit general education block that fulfills the same lower division general education requirement at all three state universities. Follow hyperlink for more information.

Transferable Degree Requirements:

Introduction to Criminal Justice

Introduction to Criminology

* Interdisciplinary Studies Requirements - *(Multi-use credits, may also fill AGECE or Associate degree requirements.)*

Communications Block (6 credits): One theory-based and one performance-based communication course required.

Choose between a Foreign Language Requirement Option or a Science Requirement Option.

Foreign Language (16 credits): Four consecutive semesters of university coursework in the same language or test equivalency.

AND

Computer Literacy (3 credits): Introduction to Computer Information Systems or similar course.

OR

Science (12 credits): take at least 12 units science courses. Some of these credits will be filled with the lab science courses and math requirements of the AGECE.

AND

Computer Literacy (6 credits): Introduction to Computer Information Systems or similar course, plus one additional CIS course more advanced than the introductory course.

Additional transferable credits to reach maximum transfer of 90 credits.

Emphasis in Criminal Justice Administration (21 credits):

The emphasis in Criminal Justice Administration ensures students develop an in-depth knowledge of their areas of interest within the criminal justice system as well as an understanding of the current, critical issues impacting the criminal justice field. This emphasis also helps students use critical thinking to connect theoretical concepts with practical criminal justice situations; a necessary skill for practitioners to succeed in the criminal justice field.

Emphasis in Intelligence Studies (21 credits):

The emphasis in intelligence studies focuses on preparing students to identify, analyze and disseminate intelligence information for the purpose of investigating all forms of criminal activity. In addition, the courses within this emphasis expose students to a variety of contemporary topics in the intelligence field. Upon completion of this course of study, students will have the skills to transition into professional intelligence careers at the local, state or federal level.

Accelerated Masters option:

*This program is available as an Accelerated Undergraduate/Graduate Plan wherein a student may start a master's degree while simultaneously completing their bachelor's degree.

Be aware that some courses may have prerequisites that you must also successfully complete. For prerequisite information, click on the course or see your advisor.

PROCESS To enter the accelerated MOL program:

- Students will apply to the graduate degree once 12 NAU credits have been completed.
- Select the graduate start term to be 1 semester after the student plans to graduate.
- In order to enroll in JUS 510 and JUS 560 students will need to be admitted to the graduate college.
- Students will need to earn either an A or B in JUS 510 and JUS 560 in order for it to count.
- Students are charged undergraduate tuition while taking the graduate level coursework in their bachelor's degree.
- Once bachelor degree is completed and posted, students will only have 8 classes remaining to complete the master's degree.
