- This program is available in person in Flagstaff, at Chandler-Gilbert CC, Glendale CC, Phoenix College, Mohave College, Yavapai County, Yuma, and Online.
- NAU's Professional Education Programs require a secondary application. Work with your Community College advisor and your <u>NAU Transfer Representative</u> to be sure you are ready.
- A minimum cumulative gpa of 2.5 is required.
- An IVP fingerprint clearance card is required.
