☐ <u>Associate of Arts in Elementary Education</u> coursework: (An AAEE is not required for admission to NAU's program, but will fill admission and program requirements.)			
☐ AGEC: The Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) is the foundation of a community college education in Arizona. Successfully completing the AGEC means all AGEC courses will transfer as a block to NAU. An AGEC is incorporated into the AAEE at Yavapai College. Some degree requirements will also fill AGEC requirements. The following course will meet program requirements and AGEC requirements: ECE 234 Child Development			
☐ Preprofessional Requirements - (Multi-use credits, may also fill AGEC or Associate degree requirements.) 6 credits of Written Communication with an average gpa of 3.0 or better. 4 credits of Natural Sciences that will also satisfy the NAU Scientific Methods course
