Additional Considerations:

- This program is available in person in Flagstaff and Yuma or Online.
- NAU's BSW requires a secondary application. Admission requirements include a "B" or better in SW 220 – Introduction to Social Work or equivalent course, as well as a minimum gpa of 2.25 and 24 credits or more completed or in progress.
- Overall gpa of 2.25 required for retention in the major.
- Students are encouraged to contact a Social Work Academic Advisor as early in their college career as possible.
- This program is accredited by the <u>Council on Social Work Education (CSWE)</u>.
- NAU offers two MSW/Master of Social Work graduate degree programs: 2-year MSW (for those who have NOT completed a BSW program) and 1-year MSW - Advanced Standing (for those who have completed a BSW program). Completion of NAU's BSW with a GPA of 3.3 or better prepares students for the accelerated-based, 1-year, MSW - Advanced Standing program. Admission to NAU's MSW must be within 5 years of completion of the BSW.
