Introduction

The Program Evaluation Report represents the NAU counseling program's systematic and empirical evaluation of program objectives, related CACREP standards, and key performance indicators (KPIs). In the report we identify a) baseline criteria for each objective measured, related KPIs indicating a measurement of skills and/or knowledge, b) methods of data collection, c) findings, and d) how the data are used for curricular and program improvements. Documented outcomes are noted in bold in the Follow Up and Program Improvement section and reflect initiated program changes. This report follows the processes outlined in the 2021-2022 Program Evaluation Plan.

Section I of this report organizes evaluation activities by the 14 program **student-focused learning objective** (SLPOs) required by all students as the main heading with associated Core CACREP and KPI standards and objectives and reports on the data collected, the analysis and review of the data, and how the data informed program improvement.

If less than 80% of students do not meet the criteria established for a SLPO, PO, or KPI metric, the counseling program institutes a required review of the course, evaluation activity, and student performance to discuss and develop program and curricular changes. Items that show a trend of mixed student performance are discussed in the faculty meetings and recommendations for program or curricular changes may be instituted.

Section II of this plan organizes evaluation activities by the CACREP standards associated with the **clinical mental health and school counseling** specialty areas as the main heading with related KPI standards and objectives.

Section III of this report organizes evaluation activities by the 2 overall program-level objectives.
