Pregnancy, Insurance: Barriers to Accessing Opioid Treatment

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Opioid agonist therapy (OAT)
 is evidence-based treatment for opioid use disorder, often using
 medications like buprenorphine or methadone. OAT decreases

the risk of overdose death and improves pregnancy outcomes

Surveying OAT providers in 4 Appalachian states in 2017 revealed





91%

of opioid treatment programs accepted pregnant patients



53%

of buprenorphine providers accepted pregnant patients



OAT providers were less likely to treat pregnant women

Train OBs & other providers to prescribe buprenorphine

Enhance reimbursement rates to improve insurance acceptance
